Passkeys – What you should know about using them

This month we will take a break in our AI journey for a discussion of something we have probably all seen appearing more frequently in our

digital travels – Passkeys.

What exactly are Passkeys? A google search on the topic provides the following summary:

“Passkeys are a modern, passwordless authentication method that replaces traditional passwords with cryptographic keys, using your device's biometrics (face/fingerprint), or a PIN, to securely log you into websites and apps. They were created for the purpose of offering superior phishing resistance, ease of use, and strong security by eliminating the need for shared secrets. Their design was intended to make them immune to keyloggers and data breaches. They work using public-private key pairs, where a unique public key stays on the server, and a private key stays on your device, syncing securely across your devices.”

Seems simple enough. We will trade traditional passwords, which can be hard to remember, especially if we have many of them, for a simpler Passkey. In addition, passwords now have to be more complex to defeat password guessing tools used by the hackers. And we certainly don't want to use the same one for all our accounts out there in the digital jungle for obvious reasons. So, Passkeys can be a reasonable alternative.

This article from AARP provides another perspective on Passkeys that you may find helpful as well.

Bye-Bye, Passwords? Why Passkeys Can Be the New Way to Log Into Apps, Sites

I hope this has provided you with a short introduction to Passkeys and some useful background on how Passkeys work. Like all technology advancements, there are risks associated with this technology. As more merchant websites and service providers adopt the use of Passkeys in the authentication methods they support, most certainly vulnerabilities will be found and they will be fixed. It's just the nature of our digital lifestyle. As you will note in these videos, and in any research, you may choose to do in learning more

about this technology, Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) and Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) are features you should definitely enable on any sites where you bank, or have payment information stored.

DID YOU KNOW??

3-second tech genius: The next time you need to print something, don't dig through menus. On **Windows**, press **Ctrl + P** to open the print menu instantly. On **Mac**, press **Cmd + P**. This works in most documents, spreadsheets and web browsers.

3-second tech genius: Buying a secondhand phone? Dial ***#06#** to see its IMEI number. Then enter it on **Stolen Phone Checker** to find out if it's been reported stolen or blocked by a carrier.

Cast your PC to a smart TV: On **Windows 11**, you can connect your desktop to your TV wirelessly if both are on the same network. If your PC doesn't have Wi-Fi, get an **adapter**. Press **Windows key + K** to open the **Cast** menu, select your TV and choose how to display it.

Know what files really are: Windows hides file name endings like .jpg, .pdf and .mp4 by default. That's risky, since a malicious file you accidentally downloaded could look like a photo but is actually an .exe (malware). Stay alert: Open File Explorer, click View in the top row, scroll to Show and tick File name extensions.

Veterans Health Shake-up, Reforms to Get Underway in Coming Months

The planned reorganization of the Veterans Affairs health system should result in improvements to VA medical facilities, increased oversight of hospitals and clinics, and better access to care at the VA and with civilian providers in the department’s community networks, VA officials said during appearances before Congress this month. In what will be the largest reorganization of the Veterans Health Administration since the 1990s, the VA plans to restructure VHA’s administration, realign staff and resources, and invest in medical facilities.

Why Some Disabled Vets Can't Get Both VA Disability and Military Retirement Pay

As reported February 5 by Brandon Wile for Military.com, servicemembers who medically retires with 19 years of service receives either military retirement pay or VA compensation, but not both in full. A servicemember who reaches 20 years gets both without offset through concurrent retirement and disability pay (CRDP). Before CRDP existed, military retirees receiving VA disability compensation had their retirement pay reduced dollar-for-dollar by their VA payments. The *2004 National Defense Authorization Act* changed this.
